She and her mother both learned the art of tatting (frivoliteter in Swedish) years ago, and Amy will show some of their work as well as the shuttles used to make this form of lace. She will also discuss other forms of handicrafts which have been common in Scandinavian countries. Handicrafts are definitely important in Sweden even today-- there is a National Association of Swedish Handicraft Societies (Hemslöjden), a non-profit organisation, which for over a hundred years has worked to highlight the value of creative handicrafts.
